ENGLISH 3-8 CREDITS

Nevada State students can be placed into English courses by submitting ACT or SAT scores or by completing the Directed Self Placement survey to better guide their placement. Students who complete Composition II will satisfy the Core Curriculum Composition requirement. Typically, students take Composition I during their first semester at the college and Composition II during the second semester.

DIRECT LEARNING 3-4 CREDITS

Students design their own empirical study, collect data from participants, and analyze and report their findings in an original research paper and conference-style poster. This option is best suited for those applying to research-oriented graduate programs.

- PSY 490** | Capstone in Psychology 3

Students conduct an extensive literature review on a topic of their choice and synthesize their findings in an original research paper and final presentation. This option is best suited for those wanting to build their professional skills for future employment.

- PSY 497** | Supervised Field Experience 4

Students complete 140 hours of undergraduate field experience (internship) in settings that provide direct clinical services; they also attend class weekly to review theory, discuss ethics, and provide group supervision. This option is best suited for those applying to clinically-oriented graduate programs.
