

- PSY 490*: Students conduct an extensive literature review on a topic of their choice and synthesize their findings in an original research paper and final presentation. This option is best for building professional skills for future employment.
- PSY 497*: Students complete 140 hours of undergraduate field experience (internship)in settings that provide direct clinical services; they also attend class weekly to review theory, discuss ethics, and provide group supervision. This option is best suited for those applying to clinically-oriented graduate programs.
