Testing Accommodations

ETS grants reasonable accommodations for persons with disabilities as defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act Amendments Act, or ADAAA ("a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities"). Not every physical or mental impairment meets this definition. Second, even if a person is found to have a disability, this doesn't automatically mean that the nature and severity of the disability warrants testing accommodations.

General accommodations Accommodation Description:

Extended test time: (all tests are timed) 25% (time and one-quarter); 50% (time and one-half); 100% (double time)

Extra breaks: breaks aren't included in test time (can be used for medication, snacks, trips to the restroom, etc.)

Accommodations for computer-delivered tests only: ergonomic keyboard; keyboard with touchpad; screen magnification; selectable background and foreground colors; trackball mouse

Assistance: human reader; human scribe

Assistance for spoken directions: oral interpreter or sign language interpreter (only for applicants who are deaf or hard of hearing)

Assistance for notetaking. For applicants who are blind, legally blind or have low vision: braille slate and stylus; Perkins Brailler®
