## Nursing Sciences Biology Course Requirements

- Contact the Office of the Registrar for information regarding the transferability of courses taken outside of Nevada State University.

### ***Biology 223***

- Biology 223 must be complete prior to applying.

### ***Biology 223, 224, and 251***

- No more than two attempts are allowed, including audits, withdraws, S/U, and any other grading options.
- All attempts taken within the past five years will be counted.
  - If the most recent attempt is older than five years, students may petition for permission to extend the expiration date to seven years.
    - Send email for petition to [nursing@nevadastate.edu](mailto:nursing@nevadastate.edu).
  - We will not accept courses past the seven-year mark.

## Nursing Sciences Biology Course Requirements Continued

- If attempted twice, only the second attempted grade will be considered for the application weight and eligibility.
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> attempt C- grades or lower, audits, withdraws, S/U, and any other grading will result in ineligibility.

## TEAS Exam Requirements

- Minimum overall score of 60% or higher.
- Minimum sectional scores of 60% or higher.
- Two-year expiration date.
- There is no limit to the number of TEAS attempts; however, a minimum of 30 days in-between attempts is required.
- Only the most recently attempted test score will be used for the application weight and eligibility consideration.
- If the TEAS test is taken from outside of Nevada State University (NS), you must have ATI submit your official scores to NS.
- TEAS Individual Performance Profile document must also be submitted with application documentation.

## Additional Information

- Be a current NS student with access to a current and up-to-date NS degree audit report (DAR)
  - Recent admits and discontinued students are at risk of not having an accurate academic record and DAR
- All prerequisite coursework must receive a C grade or higher at the time of application, and as documented on a submitted and up-to-date NS DAR.
  - Only the most recent grade earned will be used, not necessarily the highest grade.
- Minimum program specific GPA must be 3.250 or higher at the time of application, as documented on the submitted DAR.
- Minimum cumulative GPA must be 2.500 or higher at the time of application, as documented on submitted DAR.
- No more than 14 prerequisite credits can be in progress at the time of application.
  - All pending coursework must be in-progress with NS only.
  - BIOL 223 cannot be part of the 14 credits.

### *Application Timelines*

Standard Applications:

Fall Start: April 16th – June 15th

Spring Start: August 1st – September 30th

Summer Start: January 1st – February 28th

Waitlist Application:

Fall Start: June 16th – July 31st

Spring Start: October 1st – December 31st

Summer Start: March 1st – April 15th

### *Program Specific GPA*

- Is calculated from only prerequisite courses, excluding CEP 123.
- GPAs will be taken directly from student academic record, which can be found in the DAR.

## Track Timelines

### Continuous Year-Round: Fall, Spring, and Summer Semesters

#### Full-Time:

- Attends for five consecutive semesters
- Approximately 20 months
- Class, lab, and clinical days and hours will vary every semester
- Cohort of at least 32 admitted every semester

#### Full-Time Evenings:

- Attends for five consecutive semesters
- Approximately 20 months
- Class, lab, and clinical days and hours will vary every semester
- Circumstances permitting, cohorts of up to 32 are typically admitted at least once a year

#### Part-Time:

- Attends for ten consecutive semesters
- Approximately 40 months
- Requires Thursday-Saturday availability; hours will vary
- Circumstances permitting, cohorts of up to 32 are typically admitted at least once a year

### Summers Off: Fall and Spring Semesters

#### Full-Time:

- Attends for five semesters with summers off
- Approximately 28 months
- Class, lab, and clinical days and hours will vary every semester
- Circumstances permitting, cohorts of up to 32 are typically admitted at least once a year

## Application Weighted Sections

The nursing application is weighed across four academic sections: Program Specific GPA, Biology 223 grade, TEAS score, and NS Credits. Application maximum is 1,000 points.

# Application Weighted Sections Continued

## TEAS Exam Score

Point Range: 120-200

Weight of Application: 20%

Points = Total Score x 2 (i.e., 100% = 200 points, 99% = 198 points, etc.)

## NS Credits

Point Range: 0-100

Weight of Application: 10%

Points = Number of earned NS credits (i.e., 3 NS credits = 3 pts, 9 credits = 9 pts, etc.)

## Bonus: Completion of Biology 224 and 251

Point Range: 0-6

BIOL 224 or 251 in progress will not yield bonus points.

1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> attempt, maximum of 3 points for each course.

## Bonus Points: Student Nurse Association Membership and Activities

Point Range: 0-10

SNA Membership and Essay Required – Must be an active member who has participated in SNA events for bonus points. Membership and active participation will be verified through SNA.

# Application Weighted Sections Continued

## Bonus Points: Volunteer Hours with SON Simulation Lab

Point Range: 0-60

1 hour of volunteer time = 1 bonus point

## Personal Statements

Personal statement submissions are a mandatory part of the application submission and review process. Applications which do not contain the required statements will be disqualified. Statement prompts and directives will be provided in each application cycle instructions documentation. In general, the Nursing Admissions Committee will be asking for details regarding what each applicant knows about the nursing program here at Nevada State. The Committee further wants to know what plans each applicant has in place to continue working on strengthening their application for future submissions, if they are not admitted to the program in the applied to cycle. Learn about this nursing program and what this program does, or does not do, compared to other nursing programs before applying to this program. We are looking for student who can ensure the Admissions Committee, and themselves, that they are at the right place for their pursuit this very rigorous and demanding professional licensure program.

## Discretionary Assessment

The SON Admissions Committee has the authority to use discretion when determining final application scoring and offers of admissions. The committee values professional student conduct, error free essay submissions, in addition to accurate and error free application submissions. Professionally presented and error free submissions speak highly to an applicant's regard and understanding of the high academic expectations and personal responsibility required when entering a demanding and rigorous professional licensure program.
