

READING YOUR SCHEDULE

The **section** code differentiates multiple courses offered for a semester. The first character can help you identify the mode of a particular section.

Zero – In Person
Letter “O” – Online
Letter “H” – Hybrid (online & in person components)

The **course catalog number** indicates which class within a subject is tied to a particular course title and description.

This is the **course title**. For a description about the course, you can visit the course catalog or semester course search.

This is the short code for a course **subject**.

ENG 101 001 *Composition I*, 3 credits

These are the **credit hours** associated with the course.

These can also be referred to as *units*.

Here are the **days and time** a course meets. If an online section displays “TBA,” the section does not have a specified meeting time (asynchronous).

The **class number** is a unique number associated with a specific section. You can use this to search for a particular class section.

KEY TERMS TO KNOW

CORE CURRICULUM – Group of general education classes in different subjects that are required of all students for their degree.

CREDIT HOURS – Related to the approximate hours per week students are expected to dedicate to a course in the regular semester (16 week – Fall/Spring).

Ex. A 1-credit course is about three hours of course work per week. (typically about one hour in class and two hours on homework, OR one three-hour lab per week).

CREDIT LOAD – The total credits for which a student is registered in any registration period.

PREREQUISITE – The preliminary requirement(s) that must be met before a certain course may be taken.

COREQUISITE – A course that must be taken simultaneously with another course.

Ex. Science Lectures & Labs

ASYNCHRONOUS COURSE – A web-based course that does not require students and instructors to be present at the same time for online instruction.

NOTE: Course structures vary by instructor and typically include specified timeframes to complete assignments.

SYNCHRONOUS COURSE – A web-based course that meets virtually during a set class time.

NOTE: Also referred to as an “Online Live” course.

HYBRID COURSE – A course that will have web-based and in person course components.

NOTE: Review the “Class Notes” of a course section when registering for courses for information regarding whether the online portion is synchronous or asynchronous.
